## **PUBLICITY OFFICERS REPORT**

At the AGM in September I put an ultimatum to the 1st Grade clubs that if they wanted to continue to receive press coverage, that there needed to be greater commitment from clubs to providing me with match reports or I would simply cease performing this duty.

Strong verbal commitments were made. These were not universally kept but on balance, I received greater input from clubs and, on balance, the coverage we received this year was better than in recent seasons. A good result. I will elaborate more on this, but before that I feel I still need to make the following comment: The clubs that reliably provide me with material, did so even more reliably than last season. The clubs who never call me ceased to exist.

The occasionally interested group of clubs expanded to four, providing input when the relevant club official felt like it. An improvement yes, but nothing to get excited about. A bit of a hum. As a result, there was the odd weekend when I simply did not bother to prepare an article.

Fortunately, on other fronts there were also improvements to enhance the overall picture. The relationship with the Chronicle improved and staff there appeared to show genuine interest. They generally provided more space than in the past. They were also comfortable in reporting significant achievements from other grades (I would have liked to have had more detail to give).

As ever, more commitment is needed. Fortunately, we have some positive developments on which to expand. I look forward to your interest next season.

## **RECORDS SECRETARY REPORT**

### **This Season**

This has been the easiest year that I've had in the records secretary's position. It's been the year with the least number of results being lodged late. There is still some room for improvement on this count and some teams have had points docked for exceeding the number of times they are allowed to be late lodging their results or have not lodged scoresheets for some games at all. During the off-season I will be making recommendations to the Associations Executive about how we handle these issues in future seasons.

The new scorebooks have made a big difference to the type of records we are able to keep. They will be better when teams start filling them out in full, i.e. completing the header details (so I can identify which team each sheet is from), recording who has taken catches, identifying wicketkeepers and ensuring the bowling summaries are completed. If all these areas are addressed they will help my job become a lot easier.

The scoresheets have also highlighted some issues with scoring. In most games the batting and bowling generally don't balance for at least one innings, this has resulted in one game a team not reaching its target despite claiming the win (the result was not overturned as there were plenty of wickets and balls left). If teams can take a bit more care this will not happen. As part of the Executives normal review process the scorebooks will be looked at to see if improvements are needed. As part of this I will be looking at what documentation can be provided to assist teams in their scoring and completing the sheets. If anyone has any suggestions please let an Executive member know.

I'd like to thank the contacts within each club who chase up errant result sheets when I ask for them. I also want to thank my wife, Liz, for checking the Associations mail box two to three times a week.

### **The Association Statistics**

Finally, I've been able to publish the first instalment of the Association's statistics. What is shown here are the records we have from 1991 to the present day. However, they are not complete as the Associations only has result sheets from 1993/4 onwards. I've been able to find stats for those players who had their details recorded in the Annual Reports for 1991/2 and 1992/3 and will be doing the same for the years before 1991/2 over the winter. In compiling these records I've received invaluable assistance from clubs who have provided me with their scorebooks from 1992/93 backwards. If any club has books from 1978/9 to 1992/3 and are willing to let me borrow them I will be extremely grateful. My aim is to provide a comprehensive record of players and their achievements over the Association's history. Thanks to the following clubs and their officials for providing the scorebooks:
